University Study Abroad Scholarships

- Start working on these applications early.
- Personalize your essay, write about how this semester abroad will impact you
- Apply to as many as possible

- <u>The United States Japan</u>
 <u>Bridging Foundation AATJ</u>
 Amount: \$2,500 for semester
 \$4,000 for year long
 programs
- <u>Toshizo Watanabe Study</u>
 <u>Abroad Scholarship</u>
 Amount: Full cost of
 attending study abroad
 program for the semester
- Freeman Asia Scholarships Amount: Summer - \$3,000 Semester - \$5,000 Year Long- \$7,000

<u>Tips</u>

- Always look into scholarships that may be provided from the specific country that you are studying abroad to.
- Collect several copies of transcripts for study abroad scholarship applications.
- Speak to a professor ahead of time about letters of recommendation for different scholarships.
- Plan out how much time each week you are going to spend working on applications, this way you meet deadlines.
